

Matterhorn Alpine Crossing

Geneva – Aoste – Breuil-Cervinia – Petit Cervin – Zermatt – Geneva

1 day excursion



Breuil – Cervinia

Since July 1 last year, it's been possible to fly from Breuil-Cervinia to Zermatt and discover one of the most beautiful mountain ranges in the Alps, from Mt Rose to the Matterhorn,

Departure by bus from Geneva at 8 a.m., bound for the Aosta Valley.

Short stop in Entrèves for coffee (La Palud or il Ristorantino).

Then down the valley to Châtillon to take the side valley of Valtournenche to Breuil – Cervinia (1'620m), which we reach before noon.

Lunch at a typical local inn, L'Alpage.



Matterhorn Alpine Crossing

Embark on the Matterhorn Alpine Crossing at 2 p.m., the highest gondola journey across the Alps. The ascent takes you to the Testa Grigia/Rosà Plateau station at 3,458 m, leading to the Klein Matterhorn station at 3,883 m, known as the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise. Enjoy proximity to 34 peaks over 4,000 meters, with 58 in total across Switzerland. Begin the 4,164-meter Breithorn ascent, a novice-friendly route to the "4,000" peaks. The Pininfarina-designed cable car transports you through the Swiss massif, stopping at Lac Noir (2,583m) for a photo with the majestic 4,478-meter Matterhorn in the backdrop—a symbol of Zermatt's allure for adventurers.



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Zermatt

Arrive in Zermatt at 1,620 m around 5 p.m., a town rooted in mountain history since the 13th century. The first inn opened in 1839, followed by the iconic Monte Rosa hotel, a hub for mountain adventurers like Edward Whymper. Depart Zermatt at 6:13 p.m. by mountain train to Visp, then continue to Geneva, reaching at 9:55 p.m.
